Program: Melissa Vaughan and Elissa Hamon, Circles of Ashland

- Melissa is an architect in Ashland and is a board member at Circles of Ashland.
- Melissa's church started Circles of Ashland.
- Circles helps to give people who need help the bootstraps that they need to pull themselves up with. They provide training on how to get people in need out of poverty.
- Helping one person out of poverty saves the state 1.4 million dollars over their lifetime.
- Circles of Ashland also serves Mechanicsville – not just Ashland.
- Circle leaders (participants) are identified by social workers in the county or guidance counselors in the school system. Participants must have stable housing to participate.
- They meet every Thursday night and have a goal of getting people from making \$9.00/Hour up to \$21/22 dollars/Hour; they also focus on getting them out of debt.
- Circles will be hosting a poverty simulation on July 15th and will do a community update in May.

- Each Circles participant has two point people or allies that help them through their process.
- There are 65 circles groups in the nation; Ashland is the first in VA.
- Each cohort or group of Circles Leaders (participants) is a group of 15 people and each cohort is a year long.
- The allies spend four hours a week as a volunteer working with their Leaders.
- The Town of Ashland helps to fund the program.
- The first group had 6 graduates; however, 2 have sadly passed away.
- The Ashland Rotary Club just funded Circles the curriculum for the children's program.
- Meetings are held at Duncan Memorial on the Campus of Randolph Macon.
