## Program:

Dr. Quentin Ballard- Principal of Stonewall Jackson Middle School, Sarah Gathwright- Director of Counseling at Stonewall Jackson Middle School and Scott Rowe- Teacher @ Stonewall Jackson Middle School. Mentoring Program presentation.

- Be Safe, Be Kind, Be Respectful
- Mentoring is a great to get students connected to someone outside of their family and teacher who can assist them with life's challenges. They also help bring joy and tap into themselves to maximize their potential.
- Goal is to have a positive impact in the lives of kids.
- Statistics- 1 out of 3 students will finish school without a mentor. More than 50% of at risk students that have a mentor are likely to enroll in college or get into the workforce.
   75% will do service and give back. 90% will become mentors. Over 130% will enter into a lifelong profession.

- Program began in 2016. This is their 3<sup>rd</sup> year. Joint effort with Hanover Public Schools and the Virginia Mentoring Partnership. The VA Mentoring Partnership trains the mentors.
- Qualifications- the desire to help children and pass a background check.
- The Vision-The SJMS Mentorship Program strives to cultivate the whole student by
  equipping them with the skills and confidence needed to thrive. Through the
  mentorship program, students will have the opportunity to strengthen their
  school/community connection while also enhancing their cultural and social awareness.
  In order to accomplish our program objectives, it will be paramount that students be
  present in school to partner with their parents & mentors to access various levels of
  support.
- Program Objectives- bolster goal-setting, decision-making and communication skills develop leaders, foster self-confidence, instill the values of respect, responsibility, and effort. Life Skills
- Who gets invited? 3 target areas: student who struggle academically, students with discipline concerns and average to high achieving students who may benefit social from team building.
- 2016- 12 Students, 16 students the next year and projected to have 20 this year.
- Mentors- 6/11/10 Internal and 6/5/10 external mentors, 2016 to this year.
- Meeting Structure: Ice Breaker, Focus Activity, and Catch-up, mentors encouraged to meet at least once in between the regularly scheduled meetings. Focus Activities- study skills, leadership, goal-setting, respect, bullying and bystander effect, stress management, future educational planning.
- SJ Wants You- commitment: 1 evening for mentor training, 1 monthly structured group meeting, 1 flexibly scheduled monthly between mentor and mentee. And possibly attending off-site field trips such as Flying Squirrels education day or the General Assembly of Virginia.
