Program: - Patty McComas Hall, Hanover Safe Place

Bio: Patty is Director Community Engagement and Volunteer Services. She is a graduate of Virginia Tech and began her work in sexual violence at the Women's Resource Center in Radford. Over the past thirty plus years, Patty has worked at six Virginia Department of Social Services agencies as a Social Worker and multiple non-profit agencies including Greater Richmond SCAN.

Patty returned to primarily working with adult victims of violence in January, 2006, when she joined the staff at Hanover Safe Place. Over the last thirteen years, Patty has provided direct services to sexual and domestic violence victims doing counseling, case management, rapid rehousing and court advocacy.

She is also one of the creators of R-HART, the award-winning Regional Hospital Accompaniment Response Team for the Greater Richmond Area, which provides advocate services for intimate partner and sexual violence victims in local hospitals.

Patty is a 26-year resident of Hanover County and has two adult children and two grandchildren.

Program: (All, the information below is a capsule version of her presentation. I attached Patty's information sheets for additional review.)

- The Hanover Safe Place has been in place over 20 years. It offers services for victims of domestic and sexual violence for Hanover County. It has a \$1.2M budget and receives funds from Federal and State grants, the community and United Way.
- Its services are free and confidential.
- It received buy-in from VCU and Bon Secours (4 hospitals and stand-alone ERs); you will receive an advocate response within 45 minutes.
- There is always someone on call. The highest call volume is VCU and St Mary's there are more facilities available.
- The Hotline has one team to send them to the correct resource, which minimizes repeating what happened and gets them to the right place, <u>so they only need to tell their story once</u>. This is critical to the patient's well-being.
- Transportation may be an issue, and they may need to be on a bus line (This means they need to be in Richmond).

- A Housing Coordinator was hired to manage multiple jurisdictions. The average stay in shelter is 30 days. They factor in judgments, bad credit and defaults. However, this doesn't last long term. They make sure people are able to function. They also manage long term stays, as needed.
- They teach how to shop smarter and manage money to enable them to manage on their own.
- An employment specialist is available to enable clients to manage resumes and do employment interviews.
- Attorneys are available to assist with protective orders and custody issues. Abusers do file for custody to try to get them to come back.
- They have four hotel rooms (one is an office), Dental Clinic access and Immigration Services to help with Visas.
- Imminent danger needs will automatically get a room, even if it means providing an actual hotel room.
- HCA does not have a forensic nursing program. They will be sent to St Mary's.
